



U.S. Investment Visas and Green Cards for Foreign Nationals: A Three-Part Webinar Series

Many foreign entrepreneurs want to start businesses or invest in the United States. Other wealthy individuals want green cards to live in the United States, but may be hesitant because of real or perceived immigration obstacles. Real estate developers and companies seeking capital for development projects are increasingly looking for EB-5 capital from foreign investors. Several visa options exist, but each has advantages, disadvantages, and limits.

This timely three-part webinar series will help guide individual investors and others, as well as U.S. companies that want to attract foreign investors and wealthy individuals. The series will explain immigration options and offer practical real-world strategies:

- Advantages and restrictions of E-2 and L nonimmigrant visas and EB-5 green cards;
- EB-5 regional center applications and project pre-approval petitions; and
- How to successfully navigate the back end of the EB-5 process for both individual investors and regional centers
